Ever heard of "killing 2 birds with 1 stone?" Well, if not, it could be defined as "accomplishing two tasks with only one effort." And that's what my goal is hosting a golf tournament in October. With this golf tournament, I hope to achieve 2 goals: creating public awareness and increasing



contributions to our local organizations. The more publicity we have, the more people we will reach. The more people we reach, the more members we may gain. The more members we gain, the more we can do for our local community.

I have created a budget for this tournament based on what it would take to increase our contribution amounts from \$350 to \$1,000 per organization. I have budgeted revenues of \$12,200 and expenses of \$3,900 which total a net profit of \$8,300. If we divide that equally between the organizations, we will have over \$1,100 to disperse to each organization!!

Since we weren't able to sell the BBQ plates this year, we need to make up those funds and why not go ahead and blow that amount out of the water?!?! I hope you all will get on board with me and sell some sponsorships as well as finding teams to play. Our golf expenses were quoted based on 40 players (10 teams). I have already 8 teams committed to play and we need 2 more teams to meet the minimum number of teams required. I have the presenting sponsor (\$2,500) and a birdie sponsor (\$1,000) already confirmed as well. The tournament will be held at Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail on Friday, October 12, 2018 with a shot gun start at 8:30 a.m. The entry fee of \$500 per team will include cart, green fees, breakfast, lunch, 1 drink ticket, and a goody bag. I will advertise on FaceBook, in the mayor's newsletter, in the courier journal, and hopefully the TimesDaily. I am including the registration and sponsorship forms in the newsletter (See last two pages – also attached to email with this newsletter in pdf).
